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01 Introduction to the qualification

1.1 About this qualification

Qualification title: SEQ Level 3 Swim Coordinator

1.2 Who this qualification is for

This qualification is for learners who want to undertake the role of swim coordinator (or a similar job title, for example swim manager) and coordinate the safe delivery of high quality swimming programmes.

1.3 Objective of the qualification

The two objectives of the qualification are to either:

- · prepare individuals for employment as a swim coordinator or
- provide individual growth and engagement of individuals who already hold a position of swim coordinator.

1.4 What the qualification covers

The qualification covers the wide range of tasks associated with the role of a swim coordinator, develops the individual's knowledge, skills and understanding, enabling them to coordinate the safe delivery of high quality swimming programmes.

1.6 Learner entry requirements

You must:

• be 18 years of age or older on the course start date.

Swim England Qualifications' Approved Training Centres must ensure you have the relevant depth of knowledge and ability to complete the assessment successfully. The portfolio tasks will require an understanding of the swimming teacher's role in developing and delivering high quality swimming teaching as well as being able to show the proven ability to organise workforce members and lead assessment tasks.

We recommend that if you are wishing to register onto this qualification hold the SEQ Level 2 Teaching Swimming qualification (or equivalent as approved by Swim England Qualifications), but is not a requirement.

02 Assessment

2.1 Assessment summary

The assessment will consist of an externally moderated portfolio of evidence.

The assessment will actively test the swim coordinator skills of the learners and be based on a workplace scenario comprising of the type of information that would be available to a swim coordinator. Learners will answer questions based on how they would act as swim coordinator.

2.2 Assessment process

Swim England Qualifications will issue the portfolio once the learner is registered upon the qualification.

The learner has 24 months from the course start date to complete their portfolio for external moderation.

Learners will have to meet all the assessment criteria in order meet the learning outcomes in order to achieve the qualification.

2.3 Grading

Learners are not graded. They will either pass or fail.
